



STUDENT OR INTERN VISA

For studies, research or internship lasting over three months, you will need to apply for a visa presenting original and one photocopy of each of the following items:

- **National visa application form**, signed and filled out in print.
- **A recent full-face photograph**, in colour, on a light, plain and uniform background, without dark glasses or any garment that may prevent identification of the applicant.
- **Valid Passport** to be current throughout the whole length of your stay in Spain.
- **Proof of residency** in the Netherlands (residence permit, working permit, study permit, etc.)
- **Confirmation of School/University registration** issued by the academic institution in Spain. In case of students' exchange, a letter issued by both academic institutions. In case of internship, letter from the company or institution describing its main features.
- **Proof of economic means**. Bank statements for the last two months, scholarship, etc. A minimal monthly amount of 532,15€ is required. In case of financial support from parents, notarized letter from them, assuming full financial responsibility, as well as their bank statements for the last two months and copy of their Passports.
- **Proof of health insurance** with international coverage.
- **Proof of accommodation**. Hotel reservation or confirmation letter from the academic institution indicating the conditions of your accommodation. Private housing must be accompanied by a letter from the owner expressing conformity.
- A recent **medical certificate** issued by your family doctor stating: "*Mr/Ms... does not suffer from any illness that would pose a threat to public health according to the International Health Regulations 2005 (Este certificado médico acredita que el Sr./ Sra. ... no padece ninguna de las enfermedades que pueden tener repercusiones de salud pública graves de conformidad con lo dispuesto en el reglamento sanitario internacional de 2005, **included COVID-19**)*". If the certificate is issued in any language other than Spanish, certified translation into the latter.
- **ONLY FOR ADULTS (+18 years of age)**: For stays over six months (180 days), a **negative criminal record check**, issued by the authorities of the country or countries where you have lived during the past 5 years, including the Netherlands (in this country it is called VOG, and can be requested at the city council). This certificate cannot be older than three months.
- **MINORS: Notarized authorisation by parents or tutors** to travel to Spain, stating academic institution, entity or person responsible for the minor during his/her stay in Spain and foreseen duration of stay; **copy of passports of parents or tutors**.

All documents issued in any language other than Spanish must be translated into the latter. Both the original documents and the translations must be apostilled.



There is no processing fee for this kind of visa, but reciprocity fees may exist for certain countries, as is the case of the United States and Canada. The fee must be paid at the time of submitting the application.

Applicants must come in person to the Consulate offices. Please schedule your appointment on the website.

Temporary residence visa for spouse and children of student.

In order to apply for a temporary residence visa for the spouse and children of a student visa applicant, **original and one copy** of the following documents must be presented, for each one of the applications:

- **National visa application form**, signed and filled out in print.
- **A recent full-face photograph**, in colour, on a light, plain and uniform background, without dark glasses or any garment that may prevent identification of the applicant.
- **Proof of family relationship**. Marriage and/or birth certificates, with Apostille or legalised.
- **Valid Passport** for a minimum of one year before the intended date of arrival in Spain.
- Proof of residency in the Netherlands (residence permit, working permit, study permit, etc.
- **Proof of economic means**. Bank statements for the last two months, scholarship, etc. A minimal monthly amount of 399,38€ is required for the first member of the family, and 266,26€ for the rest.
- Recent **medical certificate** issued by your family doctor stating: "*Mr/Ms... does not suffer from any illness that would pose a threat to public health according to the International Health Regulations 2005 (Este certificado médico acredita que el Sr./ Sra. ... no padece ninguna de las enfermedades que pueden tener repercusiones de salud pública graves de conformidad con lo dispuesto en el reglamento sanitario internacional de 2005)*". If the certificate is issued in any language other than Spanish, certified translation into the latter.
- **ONLY FOR ADULTS (+18 years of age): A negative criminal record check**, issued by the authorities of the country or countries where you have lived during the past 5 years, including the Netherlands (in this country it is called VOG, and can be requested at the city council). This certificate cannot be older than three months.

All documents issued in any language other than Spanish must be translated into the latter. Both the original documents and the translations must be apostilled.

There is no processing fee for this kind of visa, but reciprocity fees may exist for certain countries, as is the case of the United States and Canada. The fee must be paid at the time of submitting the application.
