### **APPOINTMENT REQUIRED.**

#### **WHERE TO APPLY**

Application has to be made in person at the Spanish Consulate in Edinburgh. 63 North Castle St. Edinburgh EH2 3LJ. Please note that you must arrange an appointment well in advance in order to avoid disappointments through [cog.edimburgo.vis@maec.es](mailto:cog.edimburgo.vis@maec.es)

#### **FEES**

**The Visa administration fee is £ 54.40. Non-refundable.** Please note that this fee does not include other charges that might apply depending on the type of visa.

Citizens of UK, Australia, Canada and USA will be applied with the Principle of Reciprocity and fess will vary between £ 73.25 and £1623

#### **TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF THE SPANISH GENERAL CONSULATE IN EDINBURGH**

The following English counties:

#### **CONDITIONS OF APPLICATION**

Please note that you may only apply for a visa if you are resident in the United Kingdom and your residence permit is stamped in your passport or in separated card. Your individual circumstances in the UK will denote the documents that you must produce when you come to lodge your application.

Please note that you must produce one application per person. (Including minors)

The request for a visa must be lodged at the Spanish Consulate where the applicant is resident. If the applicant is not a permanent resident the application will have to be referred to the corresponding Spanish Embassy or Consulate and may be refused.

An appointment does not guarantee a visa.

**This Consulate General is not responsible for the expenses of the planned travel already paid by applicants and will not accept any claim for them in case of a visa refusal. DEPENDING ON INDIVIDUAL CIRCUMSTANCES ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTS MAY BE REQUIRED.**



## IMPORTANT NOTES

According to Article 17 of the Ley Organica 4/2000 the person or persons entitled to apply for this Visa are:

- 1 Spouses.
- 2 Partners if they can provide proof that the relationship was created previously to the Application being made.
- 3 Descendents (direct, spouse's or under legal guardianship) under 18 or descendents of any age with an incapacity which does not allow them to be self sufficient.
- 4 Ascendants on first grade (own or spouse's ) over 65 years old when they can provide evidences to justify their need to stay in Spain.  
The process must be started in Spain trough the Oficina de Extranjería, where the Resident must lodge an application
- 5 The process must be started in Spain through the Oficina de Extranjería, where the Resident must lodge an application. Once the Initial Authorization is granted Visa Applicant will have a period of TWO months to lodge the Application in person at this Consulate

MUST BE PROVIDED AT THE TIME OF APPLICATION.**

## LIST OF REQUIRED DOCUMENTS FOR A FAMILY REUNIFICATION VISA

- 1 Passport or travel document valid for at least 6 months beyond the intended arrival to Spain with at least two blank pages to affix the visa.
- 2 One completely filled and signed National Visa Application Form.
- 3 Ex-02 Form. 079-052 Forms to be paid at the Consulate on the day of your appointment
- 4 One recent passport colour photograph. (No more than six months old)
- 5 For non-British citizens: A UK residence permit valid for at least 3 months. It can be either in form of Visa stamped on the applicant's passport or a Residency Card.
- 6 Medical (Health ) Certificate signed and stamped by a registered doctor. This Certificate must literally state that the Applicant does not suffer of any illness which represents a risk or a danger for the public according to the International Health Regulations of 2005. The document must be translated by a Sworn Translator only, and with the Hague Apostille if the country is a member. Otherwise the document must be verified by the Spanish authorities in the country of issuance.
- 7 Certificate of Good Conduct issued by the country or countries where the applicant has resided in the past five years. The document must be translated by a Sworn Translator only, and with the Hague Apostille if the country is a member. Otherwise the document must be verified by the Spanish authorities in the country of issuance.
- 8 Copy of Initial Authorization issued by the Oficina de Extranjería.
- 9 Certified True Copy of the family member resident in Spain as well as his/her Residency Card.
- 10 Proof of relationship.
- 11 Means of maintenance in Spain.
- 12 All documents must be translated into Spanish
- 13 A prepaid "Special Delivery" envelope, up to 500 grams.

## DURATION OF APPLICATION

Please note that this type of Visas typically takes around one month to be approved but in some cases it could take slightly longer.

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
