



## **Family reunification visa**

Please find below the documents that first-grade relatives of a legal foreign resident in Spain (the resident) should submit when applying for a family reunification visa. The resident in Spain must complete another administrative process prior to the submission of the visa application by the employee. For more information on this process, kindly click [here](#).

You are requested to carefully check the [general terms for submission of Spanish residence visas](#).

The applicant should come personally to the Embassy of Spain without prior appointment (check [our address and opening hours](#)).

A consular fee must be paid in Indian rupees via draft issued in favor of Embassy of Spain when submitting a long-stay visa application. Since consular fees are set out in euros, they are subject to change. Please check our updated [list of consular fees](#).

### **Documents**

- One application form for national visa properly completed (full postal address, email address and telephone should not be omitted), dated and signed in blue ink. The visa application form is free of charge and can be downloaded [here](#). One photograph not older than 6 months of the applicant, 35-45 mm and with a white background, should be affixed on the application form.
- Passport of the applicant with at least two blank pages, valid for at least four months.
- One copy of the pages of the passport that contain biographic data (in the case of an Indian passport, these are the pages at the beginning and the end).
- Original resolution authorizing family reunification with the resident issued by the competent "Oficina de Extranjería" in Spain.
- A copy of the former document.
- Original documentation<sup>1</sup> proving family ties and relationships:
  - o Spouse: Marriage certificate<sup>1</sup>. If married before, also divorce certificate<sup>1</sup>.
  - o Children: Birth certificate<sup>1</sup> or document proving legal guardianship<sup>1</sup>. If older than 18, proof of disability<sup>1</sup>. If children from a divorced parent, divorce certificate<sup>1</sup>.
  - o Parents of the resident or those of the spouse: Birth certificate<sup>1</sup>. If parents of the spouse, birth certificate<sup>1</sup> of the spouse and marriage certificate<sup>1</sup> of the resident with the spouse.
- A copy of the former document(s)
- Original criminal record certificate(s)<sup>1</sup> issued by the countries where the applicant has resided for more than 6 months in the previous 5 years. If the applicant has resided in India, the criminal record certificate or Police Clearance Certificate must be issued by the regional passport office. Criminal record certificates are only valid for 3 months from the date of issuance.
- A copy of the former document(s).
- Original medical certificate<sup>1</sup> issued by any registered medical doctor stating that the applicant does not suffer from any disease that might have a severe impact on public health in accordance with the [International Health Regulations \(2005\)](#). This document is valid for 3 months from date of issuance.
- A copy of the former document.

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<sup>1</sup> Public documents (criminal record, marriage, birth certificates) must be submitted either with the Hague apostille or duly legalized and accompanied by an [official translation](#).
