



LEGALIZATION OF MYANMAR OFFICIAL DOCUMENTS

Read carefully the following instructions where we explain in detail the procedure for legalizing Myanmar official documents at the Embassy of Spain in Bangkok, so that they can have legal effect in Spain.

Please note that the Embassy of Spain in Bangkok does not legalize Spanish documents, it only legalizes official documents from Thailand, Cambodia, Myanmar and Laos.

Since Myanmar is not part of the Hague Apostille Convention, Myanmar documents that need to have effect in Spain cannot be apostilled, but must be legalized through the diplomatic channel, following these **6 STEPS**:

1. First, you must obtain the document from the relevant Myanmar department/agency.
2. Secondly, your Myanmar documents have to be translated first by a Notary in Myanmar. You will get a Notary Translation in English
3. Bring the Notary translation and original document to Myanmar Economic Bank Branch 5 and pay for the legalization. You will obtain a receipt. (*Address of Myanmar Economic Bank Branch: 1/7, Latha Street, Latha township, Yangon*).
4. Bring the Bank receipt + Original document + Copy+ Notary translation + ID/passport, to Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Yangon in order to legalize them -first legalization- (*MOFA's address: Zagawar Street, Dagon Township, Yangon Ph: 220244*)

Legalization at the Embassy of Spain (second legalization)

5. Once your document is legalized by the MFA of Myanmar you must bring it to the Embassy of Spain in Bangkok, so we can carry out the second legalization. Once it's legalized by us, we will notify you by email so you can come to pick it up.
6. Finally, once you have the document doubly legalized, you must have it translated into Spanish by a sworn English-Spanish translator, which you can find at the following link: [traductor jurado](#). Sworn translators have digital signatures, so you can carry out the translation online easily. This translation does not need to be legalized afterward.



OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Procedure: you can submit the document at the Embassy in the following ways:

a) In person, at the consular section of the Embassy, at *Lake Rajada Office Complex, 23rd Fl, 193/98-99 Ratchadapisek - Klongtoey, Bangkok 10110*.

b) If you cannot go to the Embassy in person, someone else can do it on your behalf (family member, friend, or agent). **IT IS NOT NECESSARY FOR THAT THIRD PERSON TO SHOW AUTHORIZATION TO SUBMIT THE DOCUMENT ON YOUR BEHALF.**

For this procedure, **NO PRIOR APPOINTMENT IS NEEDED**. Documents can be submitted directly at the Embassy from 9am to 1pm, from Monday to Friday.

c) If neither you nor a third person can go to the Embassy, you can send the documentation by courier to:

Note:	Kindly mention that it's a delivery and/or collection of "document" or "passport".
Delivery/Collection:	09:00 to 13:00 and 14:00 to 15:30 on Mondays to Thursdays, and 09:00 to 13:00 on Fridays (except for Embassy's holidays)

The Embassy assumes no responsibility of any loss or damage of your document sent by the courier, nor does tracking of your shipment. In case of destination billed costs, such as VAT or *cash on delivery* payments, the shipment will not be accepted.

When we receive the document, we will send you an email confirming the fees you need to pay and the account number for the transfer. Once the document is legalized, we will contact you again so you can arrange a messenger pick-up service. The Embassy is not authorized to recommend any particular service.



Fees: the fee for each legalization at the Embassy is 275 baht. Only cash is accepted.

Processing time: once the document is submitted at the Embassy, the processing time is 5 to 10 business days. There is no expedited or fast-track procedure. Please kindly avoid follow-up emails regarding the delivery date.

REMARKS

The Embassy can only legalize original Myanmar documents or copies certified by the same authority that issued the original document.

It is not possible to review digital documents sent by email, only paper documents (hard copy) submitted in the ways mentioned above.
