Entity Presentation (We are)

Directorate ENV.B is in charge of supporting the transformation of the European Economy into a Circular Economy by keeping the value of resources and materials in the economy for as long as possible while minimising waste.

Unit ENV.B.1 "Circular Economy, Sustainable Production & Consumption" is a dynamic team of 25 colleagues contributing to the development of the circular economy agenda and the new Bioeconomy Strategy 2025. We promote stakeholders' involvement through the Circular Economy Stakeholders Platform. We implement the EU plastics strategy and the Single-Use Plastics Directive.

We promote new rules to combat greenwashing and promote solid green claims and the use of the Environmental Footprint methods. We also promote a number of voluntary tools on sustainable consumption and production, such as the EU Ecolabel that rewards environmental excellence for several categories of products and services; EMAS (the EU eco-management and audit scheme) which assists companies and organisations in improving their environmental performance or Level(s) which assists the building professionals to develop sustainable buildings.

Job Presentation (We propose)

We propose the position of a Policy Officer for Bioeconomy. The successful candidate will contribute to the development and implementation of policies and policy tools related to the EU Bioeconomy, making the circular bioeconomy a driving force for the EU competitiveness and the reduction of CO2 emissions.

Jobholder Profile (We look for)

We are looking for a colleague with a professional background in developing policies on bioeconomy (at least two years of experience are necessary) and experience of at least one year in EU policy-making. Economic expertise is an advantage, with a focus on innovation and competitiveness and on financial institutions and instruments to scale up innovation in bioeconomy solutions and support EU businesses. Excellent drafting and communication skills in English are essential. The successful candidate should be capable of prioritizing and delivering effectively. Given the nature of the job, discretion, strong service culture, good communication and interpersonal skills, as well as excellent multi-tasking, analytical skills, organization and coordination are key.

Eligibility criteria

The secondment will be governed by the Commission Decision C(2008) 6866 of 12/11/2008 laying down rules on the secondment to the Commission of national experts and national experts in professional training (SNE Decision).

Under the terms of the SNE Decision, you need to comply with the following eligibility criteria at **the starting date** of the secondment:

• <u>Professional experience</u>: at least three years of professional experience in administrative, legal, scientific, technical, advisory or supervisory functions which are equivalent to those of function group AD.

- <u>Seniority</u>: having worked for at least one full year (12 months) with your current employer on a permanent or contract basis.
- <u>Employer:</u> must be a national, regional or local administration or an intergovernmental public organisation (IGO); exceptionally and following a specific derogation, the Commission may accept applications where your employer is a public sector body (e.g., an agency or regulatory institute), university or independent research institute.
- <u>Linguistic skills:</u> thorough knowledge of one of the EU languages and a satisfactory knowledge of another EU language to the extent necessary for the performance of the duties. If you come from a third country, you must produce evidence of a thorough knowledge of the EU language necessary for the performance of his duties.

Conditions of secondment

During the full duration of your secondment, you must remain employed and remunerated by your employer and covered by your (national) social security system.

You shall exercise your duties within the Commission under the conditions as set out by aforementioned SNE Decision and be subject to the rules on confidentiality, loyalty and absence of conflict of interest as defined therein.

In case the position is published with allowances, these can only be granted when you fulfil the conditions provided for in Article 17 of the SNE decision.

Staff posted in a European Union Delegation are required to have a security clearance (up to SECRET UE/EU SECRET level according to <u>Commission Decision (EU, Euratom) 2015/444 of 13 March 2015</u>. It is up to you to launch the vetting procedure before getting the secondment confirmation.
