OBSERVATIONS

NETHERLANDS

- For the Kingdom in Europe.

- New territorial structure of the Kingdom of the Netherlands as of 10 October 2010, notified to the Depositary via Note Verbale PA 26/2010, of 8 October 2010, of the Embassy of the Kingdom of the Netherlands in Spain:

“...With effect from 10 October 2010, the Netherlands Antilles will cease to exist. From that date onwards, the Kingdom will consist of four parts: the Netherlands, Aruba, Curaçao and Sint Marteen. Curaçao and Sint Marteen will enjoy internal self-government within the Kingdom, as do Aruba and the (former) Netherlands Antilles.

These changes constitute a modification of the internal constitutional relations within the Kingdom of the Netherlands. The Kingdom of the Netherlands will accordingly remain the subject of international law with which agreements are concluded. This modification of the structure of the Kingdom will not affect the validity of the international agreements ratified by the Kingdom for the Netherlands Antilles. These agreements, including any reservations made, will continue to apply to Curaçao and Sint Marteen.

The other islands that have until now formed part of the Netherlands Antilles – Bonaire, Sint Eustatius and Saba – will become part of the Netherlands, thus constituting “the Caribbean part of the Netherlands”. The agreements that now apply to the Netherlands Antilles will also continue to apply to these islands. The Government of the Netherlands will now be responsible for implementing these agreements...”
